Honolulu Marathon Race Day Walk (10K) Honolulu Marathon (42K) – December 13, 2009

It's just around the corner. Join in the excitement of walking either a 10K or 42K at the Honolulu Marathon in the wee hours of the morning. You must pre-register for this event. You must also be registered for the Honolulu Marathon.

The Marathon starts at Ala Moana at 5:00 a.m. (the Race Walk at 5:25). The 42K route includes downtown Honolulu along Honolulu Harbor and Aloha Tower, Ala Moana Center, Waikiki, Kapiolani Park, Diamond Head and Kahala through the bedroom communities of Waialae Iki, Aina Haina and Niu Valley, Hawaii Kai and Maunalua Bay Beach Park (the 18 mile marker). *Only 8 miles to the finish line in Kapiolani Park*.

On the return, you double back along Kalanianaole Highway. As you turn onto Kahala Avenue and Diamond Head Road and head to the finish line, you hopefully will be enjoying the gorgeous views – the luxury homes fronting Kahala Beach and Black Point, Cliffs (the popular surf spot) and the Diamond Head Lighthouse.

On a bright sunny Saturday morning 39 walkers showed up at McDonald's Manoa for a guided walk to upper Manoa Valley and the Lyon Arboretum. It was a first-time walk to the upper valley with a tour to the Lyon Arboretum, which is part of the University of Hawaii.

Since the second half of the walk is along a narrow winding road with no sidewalks, it was decided to have a guided walk this time. The highlight of this walk is the Lyon Arboretum, the only rainforest on Oahu where research is ongoing to propagate endangered species. It has many exotic tropical trees and flowers with a special section on Hawaiian plants and herbs. This walk is not part of the year-round walks. If interest warrants, the walk may be repeated annually.
