AVA Convention in Iowa – June 18-26

"Should we go to an AVA Convention and do 11 Walks in 9 days when we only do about one per month usually? Oh, let's try it. We'll just do 5Ks."

The 2011 AVA Convention was held in Des Moines, Iowa June 18-26 2011, at the Convention Complex in Des Moines. We arrived Friday, June 17th, at the Marriott Downtown along with many other attendees.

Saturday, June 18th, took us to Harrah's Casino in Council Bluffs, Iowa, where we checked in for 2 walks and awaited buses to take us the Hitchcock Nature Center for our first walk in the Loess Hills. The rains most of the morning made the hills a bit challenging. We arrived just as the rains departed, so we managed to find some dry areas to walk on as we climbed and descended the muddy hills (Carol and Dennis, who had arrived earlier, were not so lucky). Although it took us, and many others, the time of a 10K to do the 5K we quite enjoyed walking in the woods on natural surfaces and in the shade much of the time. After a bus ride back to Council Bluffs, we were on to our next walk. After crossing the only pedestrian-only bridge between two states in the U.S., which took us into Omaha, Nebraska, we reached the 5K turn-around spot without having found a place to eat. "Let's cut across to where the 10K comes close and see if we can find something to eat. Then we can follow the end of the 10K route if we are up to it." So, after finding a hotdog stand that had been set-up to catch the College Baseball World Series crowd, we kept walking, probably doing about 7.5K before we finished. Day One walking done we slogged onto the buses for the ride back to the hotel in Des Moines.

Sunday. June 19th, early wake up call. "*Whose idea was this anyway*?" The bus took us to White Rock Conservancy in Coon Rapids. It was a hot day for a walk. We met up with Carol & Dennis this time and ended up walking the full 11.4K. *After all it was only one walk today and we walked more than 11 yesterday*. We saw the tiniest frogs (or were they toads?) we had ever seen and Carol got her picture taken picking Mulberries.

Monday, June 20th, and two more walks. First we arrived by bus at the Surf Ballroom in Clear Lake, where Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens, and the Big Bopper, played their last concert before their fatal crash in a cornfield nearby. Carol & Dennis found us as they were arriving back from getting lost on the first part of the 10K. They decided to do the 5K with us since they had already done 5K while lost (*Never follow Dennis :-*)). A short bus ride took us to Mason City, the original River City in *The Music Man* movie, for the 2nd walk of the day. We started in Music Man Square, which is a replica of the 1912 streetscape used in the movie. We stopped at the Charles H. MacNader Art Museum to see the puppets from the Sound of Music. We also saw many Frank Lloyd Wright designed buildings. At the mall where we stopped to eat we found a Hawaiian Shave Ice shop. Although a little misty in the morning (Dennis's excuse for getting lost), it was quite a nice day.

There was a Walk box with three additional walks in the hotel lobby. *Do* we want to do these, or are we having enough with the Convention walks? Oh, Let's do the Skyways Walk. That should be easy. It's only a 5K, and we can do it again later if we are up to it to get 10K.

Tuesday, June 21st, off to the Living History Farms in Clive. A choice of two 5Ks or both -- one thru the Living History Farms and one thru the town of Clive. We met up with Carol and Dennis again and did the Living History Farms. After the walk we wandered around the historic buildings, and then we enjoyed a very good lunch at The Machine Shed Restaurant while waiting for the bus back to the hotel. We will have to go back another day to do Clive. For supper we joined many other convention attendees for "Everything on a Stick" and a browse around the auction items and vendor booths at the Meet & Greet.

Wednesday, June 22nd, a short bus ride to Winterset, home of John Wayne and the Bridges of Madison County. The walk started in a park and then into town. Again we opted for the 5K as Wanda decided 4 blisters on one foot were enough. Wanda found her quilts (lots of antique ones) for this trip in a small Historical Museum halfway thru the walk. She also found the Fons & Porter shop (famous TV quilters). We were pleasantly surprised to meet Maria Brasher as we were descending the hill from Checkpoint #2. We didn't know any other Menehune Marchers were going to be there. Early bus back, so people could attend the Convention Lunch and other activities. We decided to relax before joining an extra walk planned for the evening to take advantage of the "unWined" wine festival. Since it was an 11K, we decided to start early figuring the others would catch up. Well the rain cancelled the festival and most of the walkers, so we had a nice quiet Waterways Walk all to ourselves.

The Menehune Marchers is one of the American Volkssport Association (AVA) clubs. This enables us to host AVA sanctioned events in Hawaii. Our walking events can be used by participants as credit toward the IVV Individual Achievement Awards. IVV stands for International Volkssportverband, also known as the International Federation of Popular Sports. As part of the AVA, we receive guidance and support from the AVA for our events and free Thursday, June 23rd, a really short ride to Rieman Gardens in Ames to see the Big Bugs display. Again we opted for the short (6K) walk, stopping in at the Iowa State University Library to see Grant Woods' largest murals. Upon return we continued walking, through the Butterfly House and around the gardens, maybe an extra 1-2 K. Early buses back again for more Convention Festivities. We decided to check out the Feet & Footwear Assessment. It was informative and entertaining. Then off to the Barn Dance that evening on the Iowa State Fairgrounds. The food was great and many enjoyed the Square Dancing (lessons included) and the auctioning of the final items.

Friday, June 24th, no bus, so walked two blocks to the Convention Complex to check in for the Des Moines walk. Again we decided on the short (6K) walk. Set up for the weekend Art Festival, The Governor's Mansion, and Meredith Publishing were just a few of the sights we saw along the way. *That walk wasn't too bad, so let's check out the third walk in the walk box, the Capitol Walk.* We modified the 5K a bit to take us back to the Festival to check out the food options for Saturday night. After relaxing we took the elevator to the 2nd floor of the hotel for the AVA Birthday Party, the last activity of the main Convention.

Saturday, June 25th, back to long bus rides -- this one to the Veterans Memorial Stadium in Cedar Rapids. The airplane on top of the Flying Wienie restaurant and the band playing on the Kosek Bandstand in the Czech Village were just a couple of the highlights, but the most popular was the Sykora Bakery. There was so much they wanted us to see on this walk that they couldn't make it a circuit so had to bus us back to the start point. After returning to Des Moines, we walked back to the Art Festival for food and more walking around to see all the venders (more Ks to add to our total).

Sunday, June 26th, the last day for the Convention walks and the longest bus ride to the Quad Cities on the Mississippi River and Illinois border. Although the 5K only took us through one of the Quad Cities, Rock Island, we took a short detour across a bridge to Arsenal Island, just to say we crossed the Mississippi River (well, ½ way anyway). We enjoyed a self-guided tour of many historical homes using a free book passed out by a resident at the checkpoint. We also saw Maria again at the end of the walk.

All in all, we had a great time despite the sore feet and the need for more sleep. We figured about 95K in 14 walks.
