### **AVA Convention 2013**

So Carol and Dennis Romig talked us into going to the AVA Convention (again) only this time in Florida, in April and May of 2013. But wait, let's go to Universal Studios for a couple of days before the Convention too!

The 2013 AVA Convention was held in Orlando, Florida April 27 - May 5, 2013 at the Orlando Airport Marriott. We arrived three days early, on Wednesday 24 April in the afternoon at the Loews Royal Pacific Hotel, Universal Studios (it looked just like Hawaii) for our Harry Potter fix before all the Convention walking. This was also to get us in shape for the Convention Walks. 8-)

We got in shape alright, we think we walked about 5-10K Wednesday through Friday night.

Saturday we got up early to check out and drive to Clearwater Beach on the Gulf (West) Coast of Florida. Unfortunately we didn't get up early enough to get to the start while it might still have been cool in temperature. We arrived at about 10:00 AM and started our first Volksmarch of the convention. It was HOT! We decided to do the shorter of the two walks of the day and headed back to the beach, where we had our pre-ordered Cuban sandwiches, yummy! Afterward we drove to the Clearwater Marine Aquarium and saw Winter, the star of the movie "Dolphin Tale" and took a water tour of the bay.

We stayed overnight in Tampa and ate Dinner and Breakfast with Carol and Dennis.

Sunday morning we drove to Hillsborough River State Park to walk in the woods along the Hillsborough River. Very nice walk, a bit warm and humid but there was shade. Afterward we drove east to Kissimmee to our timeshare and base for the next six days of walks.

No I don't like it Not one darn bit Winter stinks In a word – that's it. Monday's walk was in Winter Park, a very pretty suburb of Orlando, with several yummy places to eat. We also walked through the Rollins College campus which was quite beautiful and situated next to one of many lakes in the area. Afterward we ate at one of the fantastic restaurants in town and then did a scenic boat tour of several of Winter Park's lakes.

For Tuesday's walk we drove to Fox Lake Sanctuary in Titusville on the eastern side of Florida for its inaugural Volksmarch. Lots of roots greeted us on the second half of the walk as the local authorities are working to restore the area to its more natural pine flatwoods and scrub habitat. After the walk Carol and Dennis joined us for lunch at a famous local foodery, the Dixie Crossroads (great corn fritters as an appetizer). Afterward we all drove to the Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge to see many different kinds of water birds. Then it was back to the *Meet & Greet Social* at the Orlando Airport Marriott.

Wednesday found us in Orlando Wetlands Park in Christmas, Florida, an area set up to treat waste water from Orlando. The birds, otters, and alligators that inhabit the area were especially interesting to see. This park is close to Titusville so afterward we ate at Dixie Crossroads again (Did I say the corn fritters were excellent? They come with powdered sugar!). Then we spent time on an airboat ride on the St. Johns River seeing alligators and many different kinds of water birds. Fantastic!

Thursday morning we drove northwest of Orlando to Leesburg. This was a good walk around Leesburg, we saw the Venetian Gardens, built in 1938 as part of Works Projects Administration (WPA). Afterward we stopped in Mount Dora, another quite beautiful town on the way back to Kissimmee. We saw several conventioneers doing extra walk(s) here, as we had on several other days. After we had cleaned up a bit, we headed to the Convention Hotel for a *Walk the Plank!* Pirate Party. Great Fun! Lots of fellow walkers dressed in all manner of Pirate attire.

Friday was the AVA President's walk starting at Fashion Square Mall in Orlando. The highlight of the walk was walking through Baldwin Park, a new neighborhood built on the site of a former Naval Training Center. It looked a lot like Disney's Celebration neighborhood, which we had driven around earlier in the week. That evening we joined the rest of the conventioneers at the hotel for *A Night in Key West* banquet, capping off the official Convention business. But there were two more days of official walks to go.

Saturday, we checked out of our Timeshare early to drive to Deland, northeast of Orlando. The walk began at the County Justice Center and proceeded around town and then into the Stetson University grounds. Afterward we drove to nearby Hontoon Island State Park where there is a YRE that many conventioneers were doing. We took a small ferry ride across to the island and checked out the walk map but decided to just relax before we checked into a local hotel.

Sunday morning we drove to Daytona Beach for the last walk of the Convention. On the way we passed Daytona Speedway (wow!). It was a beautiful cool day for the walk. We even saw a manatee in one of several marinas we walked by. Afterward we drove south to the Ponce De Leon Inlet Light Station and spent time exploring the museum there (more walking).

Monday we had left for exploring the Deland area and ended up returning to Hontoon Island State Park and walked the YRE Volksmarch on the island. Very interesting walk! Mostly flat except for the midden (large 2,000 year old Indian shellfish mound) which the walk takes you up and back. Oh and there are ticks there also, so bring plenty of bug spray if you decide to try out this walk. After we finished the walk and took the ferry back the car, we drove back to Orlando, returned the car, and got some rest before flying out Tuesday morning.

We had a great time again, thank you Carol and Dennis! We figured we walked about 90-95K between the 9 Convention walks, Hontoon Island, and Universal Studios before the Convention.

### Jane Lundquist's Pumpkin Pie Bread

Makes 2 - 9 X 5 loaves

Preheat oven 350° for metal pans or 325° for glass pans.

Combine:

4 eggs

3 C sugar

1 C oil

1 15 oz. can pumpkin puree

½ C water

Add:

3 1/2 C flour

2 t baking soda

1 t baking powder

1 T cinnamon

½ t nutmeg

1/4 t each ginger and cloves

1 t salt

Put parchment paper in pan & spray with no-stick spray.

Bake 50-70 minutes.

Yummy!
