1. The Northwest Pathfinder: Eleanor Borgardts apologizes for the quality of the Northwest Pathfinder printing. The printer quit, and gave them one week to find another printer. The printer he suggested did a lousy job – as you note with grayed pages uneven stapling, etc. There wasn't time to get it reprinted.

Please note—all copies, even those clubs get to give out at walks have the same cover as mailed copies. It would have cost an extra \$400 to have a newsprint cover. If you resend you must restamp!! The NWP will be fined if you mail with the pre-printed non-profit stamp showing.

The Northwest Pathfinder is reforming as a Washington State Volkssport Club. Evergreen State Volkssport Association no longer wants to handle the taxation issues associated with the publication. Both the ESVA and OTSVA have approved this move. Bylaws are being drafted. More later.

- 2. National Officers: The national nominating committee is looking for candidates for the offices of Secretary and for Treasurer. At present there are no candidates for these positions. on whether to join IVV Americas or not. I haven't heard when, but it will be before the convention. He does not want a floor discussion. I am personally in favor of us joining, and suggest that each of you review information on the IVV-Americas public Facebook page. Join the page and read the messages from Curt Myron, President, on the purpose of the IVV forming continental associations, and what their purposes and funding mechanisms are.

- 4. Next NEC Sacramento, January 30-31. I still haven't seen an announcement from President Dennis Michele about proposals for the NEC meeting. We will be brainstorming on Friday morning, the 30th, prior to the formal meeting, on the AVA business model. I look forward to meeting the new Executive Director, Henry Rosales at the meeting.

Workshops are decided and will be on there soon. The schedule is set and the brochure is being finalized. There will NOT be a paper registration form in the single brochure you will receive. - » November 11 (Wednesday) Veterans Day

2015 Northwest Regional Director Election Procedures For clubs in the Northwest Region

- 1. Policies The AVA policies, requirements and duties for a Regional Director can be found in Article VI "Regional Directors" in the Bylaws of the AVA. In accordance with the bylaws, Nancy Wittenberg has appointed the undersigned to the Nomination Committee.
- 2. Nominations Any individual that resides in the States of Alaska, Idaho, Oregon or Washington that is in good standing with the AVA may run for the Northwest Regional Director. If you wish to run for the Northwest Regional Director, please submit your name and a short resume to the undersigned either by email of USPS so that it arrives by close of business on the 27<sup>th</sup> of February.
- 3. Elections On the 28<sup>th</sup> of February, a list of candidate(s) and their resume(s) will be sent to each club. Each club will have 30 days in which to choose their preferred candidate and return their ballot back to the undersigned. As in the past two elections, email has been the preferred method to receive the nominations and vote for the clubs choice. If your club does not want to use email, please let me know as soon as possible so a hard copy can be mailed to you. All ballots are kept secret except for the Nominating Committee.

Hello Oregon and Washington Convention Walk Clubs

Thank you from the Convention Committee to each club volunteering to create and work one of our nine "best of the northwest" convention events. (For those providing two, we doubly thank you.)

It is time to complete the volunteer roster for the walk your club committed to host. SignUp Genius is being used to gather volunteers, their email address, phone number, t-shirt size/gender. As the contact for your club, you are being asked to:

- Forward the SignUp Genius invite to your membership and encourage them to sign up right away;
- Have someone in your club agree to enter names for those without computers

- In your message, tell your members who they can give their information to if they wish to have it entered for them. (This can be you or a member you have asked to help.) NOTE: name, phone number, t-shirt size/gender are required but only names and email addresses are viewable on SignUp Genius.
- SignUp Genius will ask each person to join SignUp Genius. This only enters an email address to allow quick and easy contact for the Volunteer Coordinators to deliver changes or emergency information to the volunteers.
- Access SignUp Genius yourself and sign up if you plan to volunteer.
- Click below to be directed to the sign-up sheets for all walks.
- Print the appropriate sign-up sheets to take to your club's group walks, events and meeting to gather volunteers who may not access email.
- Be sure to include phone number, t-shirt size and gender on printed sheets.
- Enter on SignUp Genius information gathered on printed sign-up sheets. This can be done by you or the person helping you, but remember: all volunteers must be entered on SignUp Genius.
- If necessary, contact members by phone to determine if they plan to volunteer.

But first, clubs supporting walks must account for their volunteers using SignUp Genius. Then we will be able to let others fill in the gaps.
