President's Corner: Joe Titone

1. I received the following from Kim Baker. We will discuss the below at the July meeting.

I noticed in this month's club newsletter that there will be some discussion at the July meeting about which YREs the AWW will establish or renew for 2016. Dan & I won't be able to attend the meeting that month, but wanted to pass along our thoughts for consideration.

First of all, since we are both so busy with FT jobs, we are very appreciative of the AWW, as well as other local clubs, for doing all of the legwork that must be involved in keeping so many YREs available. Although you may not see us at very many Volkssporting events (due to the fact they are held most often on Saturdays, when one of us is working), we choose 1 or 2 YREs to complete every Sunday. We greatly enjoy the variety, and the fact there are so many options right in our own backyard.

Often, we'll travel a couple of hours to do one of our favorite walks, but some days we just want to do one that's closer to home. And the walk that's closest is the one that AWW sponsors in Felida. We have done that walk backward & forward, with and without the hill (we still remember the old route), and have even modified it at times to include the Cougar & Salmon creek greenways. It has become one of our favorites over the 10 years we've been Volkswalking.

We hope that the Felida walk will continue to "make the cut" for many years to come! But if the club should still decide that it's no longer financially feasible to keep the Felida walk, please consider replacing it with a west-side Vancouver

walk, such as Frenchman's Bar/Vancouver Lake, Salmon Creek/Klineline, or Burnt Bridge Creek west.

Starting on August 16, 2015 I plan to bike 4,000 miles across America to promote Volkssporting and raise funds for Volkssporting and the Arthritis Foundation. My wife, Louise and I have been Volkssporters since 1980 with over 30,000 kilometers walked in 22 countries and all 50 states. We continue to be active walkers and in recent years have developed an interest in biking. My fund raising goal with this ride across the northern tier route from Seaside, OR to the Maine coast is to raise \$30,000 for Arthritis research and the same amount for Volkssporting. I hope you'll spread the word about my ride to all Volkssporters, family and friends in your area and consider just a small donation. Every dollar donated matters and in my website I challenge supporters to donate a penny or two for each mile I ride. I'm prepared to work hard for that donation and earn your support for both worthy causes. As part of my training I've walked over 700 miles and biked more than 1,000 miles during the first 4 months of the year and with less than 4 months to go I'll ride another 2 to 3,000 miles to work on my endurance.



You might wonder why I'm doing this ride and connecting these two programs. The answer is quite simple. Volkssporting is a perfect fit to help people with arthritis find an active life within their abilities. In their literature, the Arthritis Foundation (AF) promotes walking, biking and swimming for arthritis sufferers for better health. This connection between programs became obvious because I have two siblings with very debilitating Rheumatoid Arthritis, another sibling and several in-laws with joint replacements, and other family members and friends with various forms of arthritis. We've promoted Volkssporting to help them improve their well-being with good results. I'm convinced there are real opportunities for AVA and AF to develop a mutually beneficial partnership at the national and regional levels. I'm working with the western region AF staff in Portland OR and Seattle WA to promote our program in conjunction with walking and biking events they host in Oregon and Washington. If you have an Arthritis Walk in your area I encourage your club to reach out to the local staff to arrange sanctioned Volksmarches in conjunction with their walk, as both organizations will benefit.
