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Jan Breneman's Corner: THE WANDERING MINSTRELS

The family made famous by the 1965 Hollywood musical starring Julie Andrews was based on a true story. Captain Von Trapp did indeed marry a former nun who joined the family of seven children. They had three further children formed the Von Trapp family singers. However, once Nazi Germany annexed Austria in 1938 they decided to flee their native country.

The Hollywood movie depicted the family fleeing the Nazis after a concert, walking over the Alps to freedom in Switzerland. In real life the family crossed the Alps to Italy. Once they had escaped the Third Reich on foot, they travelled to the US and settled in Stowe, Vermont where they continued to sing as a family to earn money.
