

Rocky Mountain Rendezvous

Additional walks you might like

Castle Rock – Hike “The Rock”

Your walk begins at the Labyrinth of Christ's Episcopal Church. The town of Castle Rock, Colorado, is a "World-Class Community with a Small Town Character".

Buffalo – Clear Creek Trail

Walk includes historic downtown Buffalo, passes the outdoor pool (free to all), Jim Gatchell Museum, then meanders along scenic Clear Creek with the Big Horn Mountains in the background.

Thermopolis – Hot Springs State Park

Over colorful terraces along the Big Horn River at Thermopolis flows water from mineral hot springs. More than 8,000 gallons flow over the terrace every 24 hours at a constant temperature of 128 degrees Fahrenheit. The park has a free bathhouse where the water is maintained at 104 degrees for therapeutic bathing.

Vail – Ski Town

Walk in this picturesque mountain town known for its skiing. You'll enjoy a leisurely walk-through Vail Village, the Nature Center and the Betty Ford Gardens, and along the area's bike paths.

Denver Capital – Downtown Denver too

The walk takes you through our beautiful and historic downtown, past the Capitol Building, city gardens, the 16th St. Mall, Sakura Square, Coors Field and along the Cherry Creek and Platte River Bike Trails.

Garden of the Gods – Eleven spectacular kilometers

Route is on dirt trails through spectacular rock formations, geologic formations, and views.

Manitou Springs – European historic style

Bring your walking sticks and enjoy walking through Manitou's historical downtown and residential area on streets and sidewalks.

Larkspur – Sandstone Ranch Open Space

Enjoy all natural unpaved trails through this beautiful Colorado Open Space. Trail is on nature trails.

Victor – Rita the Rock Planter Troll

Visit Rita the Rock Planter Troll by artist Thomas Dambo. Victor elevation is 9,780 feet AMSL. Bring water and sunscreen. Route goes through town and on natural trails. Hiking boots and sticks are recommended.

Briargate – Labyrinth and Scheels
