Hud to Hou – the 2024 Northeast multi-club gathering held September 6-8, 2024 was a great success! Hearty congratulations are in order to the creative and hardworking team of Carol and Lee West of Connecticut Valley Volkssport Club(CVVC) and Andrew and Carol Schmidt of West Point Volkssport Club for a super job of overseeing the day to day planning. They spent many hours on planning calls to bring a successful regional meeting to completion! I hope you had an opportunity to attend. They had a total of 92 participants and 3 very nice walks. My favorite included walking across two bridges in **Poughkeepsie** spanning the Hudson River. If one did the 10k, we got the opportunity to walk on the Music Bridge (aka Mid Hudson Bridge); there is a panel on one of the bridge supports with 12 buttons which, when pushed, played excerpts from very danceable percussion pieces created by composer Joseph Bertolozzi. I also had an opportunity to tour the home of Eleanor Roosevelt - Val-Kill before we met at the FDR National Historic Site Visitors Center in **Hyde Park**.
